**MEMBERSHIP.** Life and patron members do not need to pay the annual membership fee, however, the centre will gratefully accept their hefty donations any time. Regular members have to renew their membership every year. Therefore, we request those who have not renewed their membership for the current year of 2004, to do so on or before September 30, 2004. The reason for this is that the Board is in the process of drafting changes to present Constitution for the approval of the membership so that current ambiguities can be eliminated and the future democratic process of governance be simplified. Only the membership has the power to change the Constitution. Board will be convening a special meeting this fall of those members who are in good standing for the year 2004 to discuss and approve the proposed changes to the present Constitution. You only become a member in good standing after you have paid the dues so please treat this matter as important. A list of members who have not renewed their membership for 2004 will be posted on the HCC's website. If you find any discrepancy with this list, please contact the Treasurer Dr. R. Harricharan or the President Dr. A. V. Singh.

**CONSTITUTION.** Revised draft of the Constitution will be ready within the next few days and discussed in a Board meeting scheduled for September 26, 2004. After the Board has approved the proposed draft, it will then be mailed to every member of HCC who is in good standing. You will be

asked to: review it, make notes of any changes that you would like to see made to the draft, attend a general meeting to discuss them, and finally approve (or reject) the revised Constitution. Please take the time to study it carefully when you receive it and make notes for discussion at the general meeting. The Constitution Committee, which also includes Mr. Hari Ramkhelawan, a lawyer, will be on hand to answer questions in the meeting. Mr. Ramkhelawan assisted in drafting the new Constitution.

**RECRUITMENT OF A PUNDIT.** Pundit Maheshwari Parasad from Patiala, India has applied for the work visa to the High Commission of Canada in New Delhi. The Canadian High Commission wrote to HCC requesting some information such as the status of HCC with regards to its registration, proof of its charitable status, most recent tax return of the centre, number of members served by this centre, etc. We have sent the necessary documents. Once they are satisfied with our status, the High Commission in New Delhi will invite Pundit Maheshwari Parasad for an interview and hopefully, he will get a visa within the next couple of months. The Board and the entire membership are extremely grateful to Pundit Dwejdendra Doobay for helping us out until our Pundit arrives from India.

**THE ISSUE WITH MR. MOHLA.** A claim has been filed by Mr. Mohla's lawyer to the Ontario Court of Justice. Our lawyer Mr. Norman Pizzale replied to this claim by agreeing on some items and disagreeing on most of them. This Board promised you transparency in its management and it intends to continue doing so. However, our lawyer (Mr. Pizzale) has instructed us, from a strategic point of view, not to publish (or announce) the full details of the claim at this point in time. When appropriate, we shall inform you of the full details.

**YOUTH GROUP.** In the last newsletter, we informed you about the creation of two scholarships for our youths. The first scholarship is an Academic Excellence Award to be granted to the individual who scores the highest marks in the best six courses in Grade 12 completed. The other is a General Achievement Award to be granted to a graduating youth for his/her combined academic and extracurricular achievements. It is hoped that these awards will be announced at the annual Diwali Dinner and Musical Evening on October 30, 2004. An application form may be found on and downloaded from our website by following the Youth Groups link on the main page. So far only one application has been received and the Board has agreed to extend the closing date for applications to October 15, 2004. If you, i.e. High School graduate of this year, are interested in one of the above scholarships, we urge you to apply immediately. The youth group had a very successful day camp in our temple on Saturday, July 31, 2004. There were about 25 youths who participated in this event. The youth group under the able guidance of Dr. Arun Prakash deserves our fondest congratulations.

**BAL BIKAS AND HERITAGE CLASSES.** Indian heritage is very rich and covers topics such as arts (creative and performing), architecture, handicrafts, religion, philosophy, history, and traditions. HCC places very high priority on the development of the knowledge of the Hindu religion and culture. The Heritage classes of HCC will be conducted on the second and fourth Sundays of each month from 11am to 12 noon. At these classes, children are introduced to the Indian heritage covering bhajans, prayers, artefacts, religion and short stories related to our festivals. The children are encouraged to perform at such HCC functions as Diwali, Holi / Ugadi, Dashami / Durga Pooja, Shankranti, Independence day, Mothers day and others to display what they have learnt in this class. This very successful program is supervised by a small team of dedicated volunteers. **MAINTENANCE OF THE TEMPLE.** The excavation near the SE corner of the entrance to the temple and also outside of the NE corner of the prayer hall was done up to the footing of the foundation wall which was then cleaned, tarred and covered with a special membrane. Before, filling back, water hose was turned on for hours to check the functioning of the weeping tiles and they seem to be working well. This should ensure no-leak through the basement wall for many years to come. The cost for this job will be under \$ 6000.00. Sincere thanks to Mr. Tara Persaud for this job done well.

When the priest house attached to the temple was built, the grading around the temple was altered and was not properly done, resulting in the final grading inspection still pending.

## EVENTS

Mr. Tara Persaud obtained a copy of the drawing from AGM Surveying Engineering, asked the contractor to complete the grading and have the final inspection done. But the contractors found serious discrepancy in the altered landscape. Consequently, we had to ask AGM Surveying Engineering to redo the grading survey of the property. After their advice, we shall ask the contractor to do the final grading. We were told that there are two catch basins (hole on the ground with cast iron grid) and a manhole on the property. We can see two catch basins, but the manhole is buried under the ground. AGM Surveying Engineering is expected to come back with what we are required to do and then contractor will complete the grading job for the final inspection to be done.

Now, we are in a position to move inside the temple for the repair and paint jobs for which we need significant amount of help from you. Please let us know your availability and expertise so that we can contact you for help.

**HOUSE ATTACHED TO THE TEMPLE.** A notice to correct the building code deficiency to the entrance of the house was given to the Board on December 10, 2003. Now, this has been fixed and successfully inspected by the City Hall building inspector. This was the final inspection and the building permit has now been closed. The help by Oghad Bhai in completing this job is highly appreciated. The Board invited “*suggestion*” from you in the last newsletter, regarding the possible usages to which the building could be put. So far no suggestion has come to the Board. #### **WORK AND ITS SECRET**

*One of the greatest lessons I have learnt in my life is to pay as much attention to the means of work as to its end. He was a great man from whom I learnt it, and his own life was a practical demonstration of this great principle.*

*Our great defect in life is that we are so much drawn to the ideal, the goal is so much more enchanting, so much more alluring, so much bigger in our mental horizon, that we lose sight of the details altogether.*

*But whenever failure comes, if we analyse it critically, the ninety-nine percent of cases we shall find that it was because we did not pay attention to the means. Proper attention to the finishing, strengthening, of the means is what we need. With means all right, the end must come. We forget that it is the cause that produces the effect; effect cannot come by itself; and unless the causes are exact, proper, and powerful, the effect will not be produced. Once the ideal is chosen and the means are determined, we may almost let go the ideal, because we are sure it will be there, when the means are perfected. When the cause is there, there is no more difficulty about the effect, the effect is bound to come.*

Excerpt from the lecture by Swami Vivekananda delivered at Los Angeles, California, January 4, 1900.
